The VHOA hopes all residents will do a portion of their environmental duties by recycling goods when possible. As our garbage service does not provide a recycling service, we offer the listings below as a few of the recyclers in the area:

Brookshire's – plastic bags and paper products

Wal-Mart – plastic (all stores), aluminum cans (some stores)

Best Buy – all kinds of used tech items

Habitat for Humanity Restore, 822 W Front St, (903) 595-6630

Building/restoration materials you don't need any more, but are too good to throw away.

Tyler Recycling Center, 414 N Bois D'Arc Ave, Tyler (903) 531-1388

- Mixed office paper, newspapers, magazines, phonebooks and ads
- Cardboard of any type (boxes must be broken down)
- Aluminum cans (no aluminum pie plates, baking tins or tin foil)
- Clear, green and brown glass bottles and jars (no mirrors)
- Tin cans and aluminum pet food cans (labels removed)
- #1 and #2 plastic bottles, milk jugs, detergent bottles (rinsed) and pill bottles
- Cell phones and chargers
- Electronics, computers, printers (there is a charge for computer monitors)
- Ink and toner cartridges
- Scrap metal (copper, aluminum, brass, steel)
- Household appliances (fees associated w/ some appliances)
- Motor oil/hydraulic fluid, anti-freeze

Many other items are accepted for recycling, call for specifics. Please separate the materials you bring to the Recycling Center.
